I believe that the meeting of the Organising Committee and members of the NOC's will be a successful one and will move our cooperation to another level for the next three months.

#### What are the organisers expecting from members of the NOC's?

I strongly believe they will be interested in the project and will try to clear up any questions or issues that might not have been so clear so far. #### The participants are going to spend three days in the Liberec Region - what is the programme?





# WHAT DID WE PREPARE FOR YOU?

### Thursday: night with the Golden Lion

There is a woman behind everything! If there was not for one unfortunate house-maid, the Hotel Zlatý Lev, where you will be accommodated, would never have been built. The unlucky woman dropped a candle and



caused a massive fire that burnt down almost the entire town of Hodkovice. After that, a clever businessman Spitschka decided to build a new home – and a hotel at the same time. It was named Zlatý Lev (Golden Lion). And because is has been preserved until today, in a bit modernised form, it is evident that the unfortunate housemaid was not employed there anymore. It gained its current art-deco style after being rebuilt by the architect Anton Worf. Liberec used to be an important Hansa town and every


notable guest hurried to be accommodated in the new establishment. Among those looking for inspiration there was Bedřich Smetana, a music composer, or the king of Vienna waltzes Johan Strauss. The Nor-

wegian polar explorer Roald Amundsen came here to warm up and the first human astronaut Yuri Gagarin arrived to relax.

Did you know... that during the closing session in the Zlatý Lev, the Organising Committee will try to demonstrate it is not only capable of organising the Festival, but also of synchronous dancing choreography?

### Friday: Sychrov with living pictures

Only a few sights can boast with so many reconstructions as the chateau of Sychrov. You will have the chance to see it yourselves before the official dinner and your journey into the past will be illustrated by live pictures. Originally



Did you know... that the name of the chateau is derived from a Czech word meaning "to shiver with cold"? It is said that when uttering the name of the chateau you can feel the chills... Fortunately, there is the Organising Committee's surprise to warm you up.



lers had to rewrite history so many times. The truth is that the owners of Sychrov changed in a great speed. First Lamotts, then Albrecht from Wallenstein, who was murdered after six years of residence. Bad luck with neighbours? And

finally the French family of Rohans. They were so proud of their castle that you can see a portrait of family members in every corner of the building. There are exactly 240 paintings. That is probably more than the current royal family in Britain owns. Famous monarch rested their heads under the roofs of Sychrov: Kaiser Franz Joseph or the Prussian king William. Even the Czech composer Bedřich Smetana came here to play the organ. However, there is no record of any "Sychrov Symphony". What a shame.

### Saturday: Ještěd as a mark of future

It is as if the peak of Ještěd, 1 012 metres tall symbol of northern Bohemia, was not tall enough. At first, a small Rohan's cottage was built, than a hotel – and many times again. Someone was not careful with fire and while defrosting the water pipes, the original hotel burnt down in 1964. And a year later Rohan's cottage followed. And why? This time it was defrosting of clothes. But

Ještěd was to experience the height of Czech inventiveness in 1973. It was expected that the new television tower would quite logically stand next to the main building, but the architect Karel Hubáček aimed directly into architectonic future. The hotel, restaurant and TV tower were put into



a single futuristic building – a tower in form of rotating hyperboloid, which not only added 94 meters to the overall height, but also completed the peak's profile. From the valley, it resembles an extravagant flying saucer, parked here by alien visitors. And who knows, maybe you will witness their peaceful intentions yourselves during dinner...

Did you know... that you can reach the top of Ještěd with a cable way, which is in operation from 1933? It is 1,188 meters long and one journey takes four minutes.
